The African Humanities Program (AHP) and Generation Social Sciences are grant awarding programs that offer financial awards ranging between \$13,000 to \$19,000 dollars successful African scholars/researchers from Ghana, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda. The aim of the award is to support researches in African Humanities and Social Sciences. Sponsored by the Carnegie Corporation of New York, these two awards are administered under the auspices of American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS) and Social Science Research Council (SSRN) respectively.

The 2019 Proposal Writing Workshop aims at helping prospective applicants to prepare for international competitions such as the annual African Humanities Program and Next Generation Program competitions.

Over the years, our researches at KANAC, show that, although many Nigerian scholars submit proposals to these programs, only very few have emerged successful. It was further revealed that many of these budding researchers were neither aware, nor conversant with some of the necessary techniques and requirements for writing successful proposals for international competitions. This informs the need for international writing workshops such as the current annual Proposal Writing Workshop.



The 2019 Proposal Writing workshop is organized by Godfrey Okoye University, in collaboration with KANAC. This year's Proposal Writing Workshop, which will be held in the serene environment of Enugu, the ancient Coal city of Nigeria, provides ample opportunities for workshop participants to interact with international Mentors and Advisers from AHP. Participants shall also be given access to the unique coaching and mentoring services provided by the KANAC group.

During the workshop sessions, participants will learn:

- 1. How to generate award winning topics.
- 2. How to write successful proposals that will win international awards.
- 3. How to use AHP research methodology.
- 4. Networking and international connections. Furthermore, written proposals will be thoroughly reviewed by a team of AHP experts.



To be eligible to participate in this workshop, please note the following:

- An intending participant must register online by paying the workshop fee of Ten thousand Naira (10,500) only. To register now go to www.kanac.org. **Deadline for online registration is** extended till 3rd October, 2019. Registration at the gate is N12,000.
- An intending participant, who wants his/her proposal to be reviewed by the international AHP Mentors and Advisers must submit a full length proposal and an abstract of not more 300 words to proposalwriting@kanac.org on or before 15th September, 2019.
